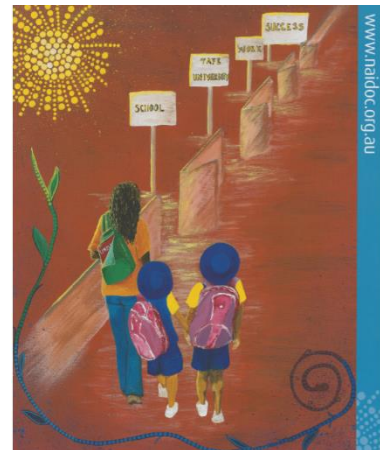
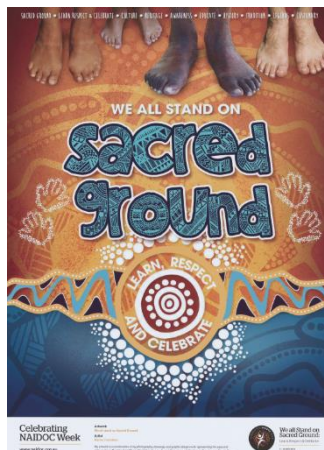
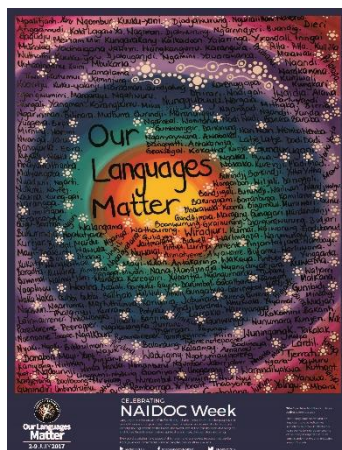
Let's work together for a shared future.

This year's NAIDOC theme is ***Voice, Treaty, Truth: Let's work together for a shared future.***

The competition allows schools and students to showcase their creative talent, build on their knowledge of Indigenous culture and to celebrate and contribute to NAIDOC week within their own community.

Terms & Conditions

- I. Entry is open to all P-12 students enrolled in a South East Region State School.
- II. All artwork should be representative of the 2019 NAIDOC theme: Voice, Treaty, Truth and be inspired by Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander perspectives.
- III. Entries open **Monday 18 February 2019**, and close **Friday 5 April 2019 at 4pm**.
- IV. Entries **must be mailed or delivered to the SER Regional office by 4pm, Friday 5 April 2019**.
(Mail: P.O.Box 492, Oxenford, Qld, 4210: Physical: Level 1, 340 Hope Island Road, Hope Island).
- V. All entries must be drawn or painted on paper no larger than A3 size.
- VI. No responsibility will be taken for lost, delayed or misplaced entries.
- VII. All entries must be clearly labelled on the back with the entrant's name, age, school and year level.
- VIII. Whilst the Department of Education will take all possible care, no responsibility will be taken for any damage, which may occur during the displaying of the artwork or within the competition period.
- IX. All artwork entered will be displayed/hung at the South East Region's NAIDOC Exhibition.
- X. The judging will take place after the competition closes. The judges' decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered in to.
- XI. After judging, the winning artwork will become the property of the South East Region Department of Education and may be used to promote the South East Region's 2019 NAIDOC Awards and/or on the South East Region NAIDOC Awards.
- XII. The winner will be notified on Friday 26 April 2019.
